PHASE I CAPITAL PROJECT UPDATE

As you probably already know, the 100-year-old Port Jervis Middle School is closed again this school year for major renovations and an addition to the building. Considered to be one of the most beautiful and iconic buildings in the City of Port Jervis, it will be renovated from top to bottom and become a grades K-5 elementary school upon completion. The new addition to the building will include the main office, cafeteria, gymnasium and an elevator.

ASK will move from the Route 209 campus to East Main Street and will open as a K-5 school in September 2024. We originally had planned to occupy some parts of the school next spring but construction delays led us to the decision to move the entire school at once. The first floor will house kindergarten, grade one and music classrooms. The second floor will be for grades two and three. The third floor will be for grades four and five as well as the art room, STEAM lab and library. An open house and ribbon cutting will occur in late August 2024, just prior to the first day of school.

Having PJHS and PJMS together on one campus has many benefits. First, there will no longer be elementary students on campus with the older students. Second, middle school students will benefit by having access to better facilities and advanced courses. Third, it will be easier to share hard to fill teaching positions when both schools are under one roof and use the same bell schedule. Fourth, bus rides will be shorter since all the students are traveling to one location.

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FALL SPORTS UPDATE

Port Jervis Athletics had a fantastic fall season!! Our modified and JV teams were very successful this year with not only participation numbers, but also with our competitiveness against other schools throughout the season. We had multiple Varsity teams qualify for sections and an individual who qualified for State Championships.


CAPITAL PROJECT PHASES II & III: WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW

One of the keys to keeping our current families and attracting new ones is to have first-class facilities. Whether it is new classrooms, labs, performing arts spaces, libraries or sports fields, the goal is to build and/or renovate our facilities to meet the needs of today's students. It is so exciting to see all the good things coming to Port Jervis!

Phase II of the capital project will focus on the Route 209 campus and will take place during the spring and summer of 2024. The current ASK Elementary will become the grades 6-8 Port Jervis Middle School starting in the fall of 2024 so there is a great deal of work to do as part of this conversion from an elementary school to a middle school.

The High School athletic fields and tennis courts will be completely redone. The playground area at ASK Elementary will be turned into athletic fields for the modified sports of soccer, baseball and softball. Also taking place over the summer of 2024 will be the conversion of some typical classroom space into specialized settings such as a technology education woodshop, family and consumer science kitchens, and art classrooms. The current ASK cafeteria will be converted into a music suite containing a chorus room, band room, practice rooms and an instrument storage area. The new middle school cafeteria will be adjacent to the large kitchen at the high school. Some of you may remember when the ASK cafeteria was there in the 1960s through the 1990s.

Phase III, which was approved by the voters last May, includes a host of projects that will take our district's facilities to the next level. The High School library is moving downstairs to the newer wing built in 1989-90 and will be approximately 50% larger. The current library will become two science classrooms. The auditorium will see significant improvements to its aesthetics and the sound system. Chase Field at the High School is getting new FieldTurf artificial grass and a new track. It will also be getting a new scoreboard and new lights were installed earlier this fall (see below). Glennette Field at the old Middle School/new elementary school is also getting FieldTurf artificial grass, new lights and a new scoreboard. A generator is being added to the new elementary school on East Main Street. There is also a new parking lot being built between the school and Gray-Parker Funeral Home on the former Statewide Oil property.
