Dr. Horsman is well known in Port Jervis because his dental practice was open from1954 to 2002, an amazing run of 48 years! He was a First Lieutenant in the U.S. Army-Air Force during World War II deployed in the Pacific Theatre from 1943-46. He then earned his Bachelor's degree from Hamilton College in 1950 and his D.D.S. degree from the University of Pennsylvania in 1954. He is a past president of the Orange-Sullivan Dental Association and served on the medical staff of St. Francis/Mercy Hospital.
