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"Leave One Add One" Instructions for teachers


- **Time**: Approximately 30 minutes total
- **Grade level**: 5th grade through graduate school.

You can also use this for professional development!

• **Materials**: Blank paper and pencils/pens

Retrieval practice is a **learning** strategy 😅

- 1. Get a piece of paper
- 2. Don't write your name on it (this is not for a grade!)
- 3. Quickly draw a small animal in the top right corner




Next step: retrieve!

Top of your paper: Write down **one** thing you've learned in our class


At least one sentence, please

(can be anything from the readings, class discussions, videos, projects, etc.)



Here's the fun part

- 1. Leave one: Hold your paper up when you're done
- 2. I'll hand you someone else's paper
- Add one: add one new thing that's not listed (something that's new for you, too)
- 4. Repeat! (new concept each time)



What's something interesting that someone else wrote on your paper?
