

## Challenges to CYSHCN Families:


- Advocating

- Free Program
- Available to <u>anyone</u> from <u>birth to 21</u> years of age that has a Special Health Care Need
  - Special Health Care Need = Requires additional resources




#### CYSHCN PROGRAM

   Services Block Grant


# GOALS OF CYSHCN PROGRAM
