Google Classroom

Google Classroom is a free and secure learning space for teachers, students and schools. It provides a safe way for teachers and students to connect, share content, access homework, participate in discussions and receive class information.

Using Google Classroom allows you and your child to have access to course work at any time through the Internet and is accessible online and through any mobile devices with Internet capabilities—including iPhone, iPad and Android devices. Additionally, the use of Classroom will help keep students informed of due dates, assignments and grades. Classroom is also useful to check on work missed when absent and to ask questions about assignments.

Google Forms

Google Forms allows your child to create forms for data collection purposes. Students and teachers can use Google Forms to create surveys, quizzes, and more. The form is web-based and can be shared with respondents by sending a link, emailing a message, or embedding it into a web page or blog post. Data gathered using the form is typically stored in a spreadsheet.
